Local radio stations should broadcast school closures and display them on their websites although this may take some time. We will send out a text message to all parents, as long as the internet is up and running as our system is web-based.

If the weather conditions deteriorate during the school day, we will always endeavour to contact you by text message or phone and the school will remain open until all children are collected. If we cannot contact you and the school needs to be closed urgently, we will, as stated in our admission form, arrange for another parent to look after your child until you can be contacted. Please ensure that the school office has your up to date contact details.
