Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you have all had a great 2 weeks. It has been extremely busy here at Broadmayne with lots of visitors and meetings which have kept me from being at the entrance at the start and end of the school day. Our visitors have included our Educational Challenge Lead spending the morning observing classes as well as a whole day with a Health and Safety Advisor. All of our visitors have recognised how hard we are working to achieve 'flying high' aspirations for all of our staff, children and our environment, and have provided us with ways that we can fly even higher. I am working on our School Development Plan at the moment and when this has been finalised with staff, I will share a copy within the newsletter. I am very keen for us to work together to achieve great things for everybody at Broadmayne - Team work makes the dream work!

Parent/ Staff Communication

We believe that clear, open communication between us and families has a positive impact on pupils' learning. Most importantly it builds trust between home and school which helps the school better support each child's educational and pastoral needs. Over the last half term, we have seen an increase in the number of daily emails that staff are receiving and whilst we want to respond to each one as soon as they arrive, this is not always possible due to them teaching or having family commitments. From next week, you will see that staff will have the following disclaimer at the bottom of their emails:

'The wellbeing of staff at Broadmayne First School is a priority and our email protocol allows staff to send emails when it is most convenient for them to do so. Staff will check their emails at least once a day between the hours of 8am and 4pm, but are not expected to respond to emails sent outside these times unless they wish to do so. Please be aware that some staff are part time and have different hours and therefore may not respond until they are next back in school.'.











Whilst I appreciate that hearing incidents that have occurred at school are upsetting to hear, please can I encourage all email communication to follow our school values of being kind, safe and respectful.
